What's New

- 10th Anniversary
 - SMART turned 10 years old this year
 - Worked with MNDOT consultant on marketing plan includes several ideas to highlight anniversary
 - Doing various activities throughout the year to highlight SMART's accomplishments
 - Handed out special 10th Anniversary bags to passengers early in the year
 - Promoting our 10th Anniversary on social media (weekly posts)
 - Meeting with local governmental groups throughout our service area
 - Have met with city councils in three of four cities, and commissioners in two of four (Mower County scheduled next week)
 - Have ideas to continue promotion throughout the year
 - o Currently looking at special 10th Anniversary magnets for this spring or summer

• SMART Functional Updates

- Training
 - Working on training for staff CPR and Defensive Driving
 - CPR yesterday which went well (Joanne's favorite training to do)
 - Working with MNDOT/RTAP for the Spring Workshop
 - Helping with planning for the annual workshop and determining breakout sessions and topics
- Austin/Albert Lea/Dispatch
 - Overall a good year for the southern counties
 - Dispatch and Albert Lea are fully staffed

- Austin has a couple openings that we are working to fill
- Ridership is going well, especially in Albert Lea with our Route Bus
 - Taxi service shut down which has caused an increase need for transportation services
- Meeting more with the city on transportation discussions working to address to the growing needs
- Owatonna/Waseca
 - Shelly Rockman has retired from full time employment and taken a position with the school district
 - Continue to be short drivers which is impacting service
 - Working to fill driver positions and manager position
- MNDOT Update
 - Capital
 - Vehicles
 - Vehicle Replacement
 - o 2020-21 Bus Grants/Contracts
 - Ordered six replacement buses (from 2020 capital grant; two in Austin, two in Albert Lea, one in Owatonna, and one in Waseca)
 - Received first bus from 2020 order in May, 2022
 - Ordered five replacement buses (from 2021 capital grant; one in Austin, one in Owatonna, and three in Waseca)
 - 2020-21 Bus Contracts received amendments due to pricing increases
 - Last four buses hopefully coming soon ??
 - Two in both Austin and Waseca
 - 2022 Bus Grant/Contract
 - Approved for two buses from 2022 Vehicle Replacement grant; one in Austin, one in Albert Lea
 - Two buses have been ordered through North Central
 - Hoping to see these buses sometime this summer
 - o 2023 Vehicle Replacement
 - Requested eight buses for replacement, was approved for four (award letter)
 - Two buses in Austin, two buses in Owatonna
 - Significant price increase:
 - Nearly 40% over 2022 ordering price
 - Increase of 101% from 2021 ordering price
 - Recently received notice of yet another increase Now approx.
 115% increase over original 2020 price
 - Ordered four buses in early November two with I State and two with North Central
 - I State buses could be delivered as early as summer 2024
 - North Central buses will likely be delivered late 2024 to early 2025
 - o 2024 Vehicle Replacement
 - MNDOT vehicle solicitation closed mid-November
 - Requested eight replacement vehicles
 - Predicted price per MnDOT is \$232,000
 - MNDOT initially approved no buses
 - Later received email about one bus #132 (Austin)
 - This week received email about two additional buses #127/#312
 - ** These were due to lower prices than originally discovered (\$204,300)
 - Low-No Emission Grant BETTER

- Worked with MNDOT and three other agencies to apply for an exciting opportunity to bring an electric bus to SMART
- "Buses Electrified To Travel Efficiently in Rural" MN Communities application was completed the last week of May
- o Notice was received mid-August, 2022, that MNDOT's grant was approved
 - Tentative time for bus arrival is 2025
- Working with MNDOT consultant on the project regular meetings scheduled
- Bus Disposition
 - Disposed of six buses late 2023
- Facilities
 - Austin and Waseca facility approved through MNDOT grant Future projects
 - Working with MNDOT Consulting team on first steps for Austin and Waseca facilities
 - Some big changes with capital projects given potential funding opportunities will know more in the coming weeks
- Other
 - Received funding through a Technology Grant for additional camera hardware that will assist managers with accessing video footage
 - Looking to submit a 2024 Technology Grant application for new routing software
 - Will utilize MNDOT consultants to assist with application process
 - Have timeline for various grant opportunities through MNDOT and will begin working on them later this spring (2025 Operating, Vehicle Replacement, etc.)
- Big Picture Down the Road
 - o Resume normal service hours
 - Looking at services and resume as able (staffing)
 - Cedar Valley Services Update
 - Completed merger with KCQ in Faribault (75 workers, 5 staff)
 - Worked through another CARF accreditation (three year) last month
 - Required for the various programs CVS offers

2024 Program Goals - Ideas?

- Continue to streamline and simplify process and policies
- Fill open staffing positions throughout agency and resume suspended services
- Any other goals/ideas?
